WIS Principles



WIS PRINCIPLES

Drawn from our school's foundational documents and informed by community conversations and educational research, these WIS Principles summarise our values, inform our decisions, and serve as a means of measuring the integrity of our policies, practices, and approaches to teaching and learning.



Learning is a process of making meaning, and must be driven by a clear and intentional purpose. Learners are more engaged when they are convinced by 'the why', so we apply our learning to address real-world problems and an end that is bigger than ourselves. A sense of purpose serves as a driving force to push us through adversity and the challenges of daily life. We begin with the end in mind.

- Does this activity have clarity of purpose?
- Do we have clear criteria for success and a plan to achieve it?



We view WIS as a community, rather than an institution, because we believe that relationships have the most powerful influence on learner success. At WIS, we learn from those around us and we know that our differences make us stronger. We are proud of our diversity of culture, language, race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, belief, tradition, ancestry, and socio-economic status. We want our learners to cultivate a strong sense of self. We recognise that each person holds multiple identities and has a unique personal story to tell.

- Do others feel cared for in my presence and through my actions?

We believe that learners develop the dispositions of excellence when they are surrounded by a community which models, sets, and keeps high expectations. We believe that all people already possess within themselves all the ability and compassion that is necessary to make a positive difference in our world. It is our collective and individual responsibility to set high expectations for ourselves and to model these characteristics for others.

Learning is a deeply personal, social, and emotional process. When we take ownership of our process, it becomes possible to try new things with a positive attitude and high expectations. We are all different, and we all have the right to own our learning story. The time and pace of each person's journey is unique. We believe that learners rise to expectations and that motivation must come from within.

We can never predict which experience will bring about a life-long passion, so we encourage learners to explore and to try new things. We are naturally curious and playful. We learn through a lifelong cycle of inquiry. We know that the world's problems will not be solved at the same level they were created, so we must make space for imagination, divergent thinking, and exploration.

WIS Bullying Prevention





Windhoek International School (WIS) was founded in December 1990, the year in which Namibia achieved independence. We opened our doors to our first students in January 1991 and in 2026 we will proudly celebrate our 35th birthday.

WIS is Namibia's international school. The school was founded to serve the needs of the children of the international community in Namibia and of those Namibian families who are attracted by its combination of strong academics, service-oriented curriculum, holistic and student-centred approach to learning, and internationally minded values. It is a not-for-profit entity governed by a volunteer Board of Directors.

We moved to our present spacious campus in 1994 and have steadily added facilities. We have also grown. What began as a small school in 1991 today enrolls more than 450 students aged from 3 to 18 and employs nearly 80 teachers and other educational specialists from over twenty countries. Around 70 languages are able to be spoken on campus. The language of instruction is English and we also offer French, German and Portuguese.

We have been an International Baccalaureate World School since the 1990s. In fact, WIS is the only IB school in Namibia. With the PYP, MYP eAssessment, and IB Diploma, our students are following internationally recognised courses with external validation. Students graduate with credentials which allow them to pursue higher education at the best fit university of their choice in any country in the world.

The school is a member of the Council of International Schools (CIS) and is fully accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). The school is proud of its inclusive ethos. We see diversity as a strength and WIS is without a doubt the most diverse community of learners in Windhoek.
